Seminar: Brexit – current developments

On 31 January, the United Kingdom has left the European Union. The seminar will address the legal consequences, analyze the so-called Withdrawal Agreement and discuss current developments, particularly the negotiations on an agreement on the future relations.

In detail, the seminar will address the following issues:

- The Withdrawal Agreement and its Protocol on Northern Ireland
- The Northern Ireland question and the Good Friday Agreements
- Implications for environmental protection, labor standards and consumer protection
- Issues concerning competition, subsidies, intellectual property and taxes
- The level playing field and the negotiations of a trade agreement
